Richmond Youth Centre

The Richmond Youth Center provides a variety of activities and support for kids, youth and the community. Some of the key programs, activities and events during the past year and highlighted below.

ASIAN YOUTH OUTREACH PROGRAM

The Asian Youth Outreach Program offers one-to-one support with academic, career planning, counselling, life skills and pre-employment to Asian youth ages 13 to 24 in English, Cantonese, and Mandarin. Individuals in this program will work with a youth worker on a weekly or bi-weekly basis to help them reach their goals.

DAY CAMPS

During summer and spring break, RYSA offers a day camp for elementary students (ages 7-12) that includes crafts, cooking, physical activity, group games, fun outings and so much more! The camps help children build social connections with their peers and the youth mentors and staff that lead the activities. This program also offers leadership opportunities and training for high school youth. This is a fee for service program, but subsidies are available for families who need financial assistance.

GENERATIONS HOMEWORK CLUB

The Generations Homework Club is an afterschool program that provides opportunities for kids with homework help while developing positive relationships with others. It is led by a team of trained volunteer youth and adult tutor-mentors who work with the kids to organize fun activities that build confidence, skills and self-esteem as well as support learning and social development.

RICHMOND SCHOOL PROGRAM

The Richmond School Program provides intensive family-centered treatment and support to elementary school children living in the Richmond School District, for whom success in school has been limited by social, emotional, behavioural and/or psychiatric difficulties. The goal of the program is to support children, families, and the school to provide an opportunity for each child to be successful. RYSA provides two child and family workers that work with kids one-on-one or in small groups to support the goals for each child.

ROGERS CONNECTIONS PROGRAM



The Rogers Connections Program supports youth ages 13 to 19 to develop life skills, improve school success and utilize community resources. The program offers several locations for youth to be involved in fun activities, connect with tutors and mentors and receive one-to-one support. High school youth are welcome to drop-in where youth can access the support they need. The program also offers activities and events for youth during the summer to support learning, skill development and community connections. Volunteer opportunities are available to university students or adults to be trained as tutors or mentors who can support them with their career and life goals.

STATION STRETCH PROGRAM

RYSA provides a Youth and Family Counsellor at the Station Stretch Program. Our Youth and Family Counsellor provides intensive one-to-one support, community information and referrals, developing life skills, follow up and family support to youth ages 13 to 17 who commonly struggle with academic issues, social and emotional challenges, drug misuse, involvement with the justice system, and truancy. The objective of the program is to enable the student to complete grade 10 in four core subjects and support them to reintegrate into the school system at the senior level.

STAY IN SCHOOL PROGRAM



The Richmond Stay in School Program supports kids to stay in school and work towards personal success while overcoming personal challenges and barriers through recognizing their efforts and achievement. Recipients include youth in elementary school, alternative program graduates, elementary school graduates, high school graduates, and those who show commitment to their community and are making a difference.

U-CONNECT



U-Connect is a youth-driven volunteer program that empowers youth through learning new skills, meeting new people, and contributing back to the greater community. U-Connect is subdivided into 2 teams: U-Do primarily focuses on making an impact in the greater community by identifying community issues, developing activities and raising funds which provides opportunities to build new skills and develop leadership. U-Write is involved in gathering and writing information for Clixmag, our online youth magazine for the community, and supporting U-Do projects. This program has had a huge positive impact on the community from helping seniors and mentoring younger kids, cleaning beaches, organizing community events and raising funds for the community.



Pathways Aboriginal Centre

Pathways Aboriginal Centre provides a gathering place for Aboriginal children, youth and families with activities towards increasing cultural awareness and connection, health and wellness and support for Aboriginal people to achieve their goals.

OSKAYAK YOUTH PROGRAM

The Oskayak Youth Program provides youth between the ages of 14 to 24 an opportunity to connect with their culture, socialize, gain new skills, obtain community resources, participate in group activities and receive one-to-one support. Aboriginal youth are supported to explore their culture, learn new skills, participate in sharing their culture with the community, and working towards their personal goals. Youth are actively involved in setting priorities, developing activities, and reaching out to the community. There is an Aboriginal Youth Advisory Council that includes youth who help lead the Centre.

PATHWAYS ABORIGINAL OUTREACH EDUCATION PROGRAM

This program provides support to students of Aboriginal ancestry and their families, with the goal of supporting their physical, emotional, intellectual, and social development. Services include advocacy, one-to-one support, mediation, skill building, cultural workshops, and family drop-in nights. This program also offers assistance to find and use housing, medical, legal, employment, and other community services. We work to support each child towards personal success in school and in life. Additional support are available through volunteers and the Centre to help youth with learning and one-to-one support.

RAVENS HOMEWORK CLUB

The Ravens Homework Club is a program that supports Aboriginal children and youth with tutoring and mentorship activities. The Club works with kids afterschool and provides them with opportunities to have fun and receive support with homework while developing positive relationships with others. A number of older youth and adults receive training to work as volunteer with kids and organize fun activities. At the end of the day, we want kids to be positively engaged, to develop positive relationships and to see how learning can be fun.

Job Options BC

Job Options BC Richmond/South Delta is an employment and training program designed to help unemployed local residents find new employment opportunities.

There are two streams of the Job Options Program: one for age 18 and up and the Urban Older Workers Program that specializes in job seekers who are 55 and older.

JOB OPTIONS BC

"Getting a job within just few weeks is amazing; actually I didn't believe I could make it until my job started. The program provides career exploration, skill development, short-term training, a training allowance, and subsidized work experience placements.

Participants are provided support both in class and on the job support for up to 6 months. Training allowances can be provided for up to 6 weeks and wage subsidies for up to 10 weeks. Additional resources are available to support participants with start up costs for uniforms, supplies and other materials, as well as transportation.

URBAN OLDER WORKERS

The Urban Older Workers Program offers up to 12 weeks of group and individual programming, short-term training and work experience that prepares participants for new employment, or when appropriate, further training. Participants attend five weeks of group activities followed by the work experience and follow up phases. Classroom activities include self and vocational assessments, job search skills training, life skills training, employment counselling, basic skills upgrading, computer training, short-term certificate training, sector specific career corners, customized job search coaching and on-going support.

Each year RYSA recognizes students who overcome barriers to continue with their education. \$500: Sponsor a Youth to Attend "Gathering Our Voices"



The Gathering Our Voices Conference (GOV) is an opportunity for Aboriginal youth between the ages of 14 to 24 to participate once a year in a dynamic community gathering where youth will discuss and learn about important issues such as health, language, their culture and the environment. This past year more than 2000 Aboriginal Youth came together to share and learn about themselves and their culture. This is a vital opportunity to empower our youth so they can continue making their way in the world proud of who they are and their culture.

\$1,000: Sponsor a Workshop Series

One of the ways we serve the community's needs is through specialized workshop series. Workshops we have led in the past include Job Search Skills, Study Skills, Aboriginal Art, Drumming, Video Production and much more. These workshops help our community members to reach their life, career and educational goals. Organizations have donated money to support workshops that reflect their passions and serve our client's needs. Our staff would be happy to work with you to find the right workshop to match your vision with our programs.

\$2,500: Sponsor a Seniors ESL Class

Help elders in our community build a sense of belonging through sponsoring a 6-week Conversational English Class. Many seniors are isolated due to their language barrier and this program gives them the skills and confidence to engage in community activities, make friends and access services. There is a high need in our community for this program.

\$3,500: Sponsor a Week-long Day Camp

RYSA day camps are highly subsidized in order to make camp and out-of-school care affordable for Richmond families and many families cannot afford to pay at all. Our camps include five days of fun activities, outings, social connections and educational opportunities. Your donation will allow more children to have an enriched summer experience filled with friendship and fun.

\$5,000: Sponsor a Special Event

Throughout the year we host several special events that are open to the community including Youth Forum, Summer Fair and National Aboriginal Day. As a major sponsor for a Special Event, your organization will help to bring our community together for celebration and learning, as well as your logo will appear on all promotional material bringing the attention of community members and event attendees.

\$7,500: Sponsor an Elementary Homework Club We offer free homework clubs for elementary school students.

These programs not only help students with their educational pursuits but also offer an opportunity for children to build social skills through mentorship by our dedicated, trained volunteers. Your donation would provide ten children with one-to-one support twice a week for an entire school year helping them to increase their confidence while having fun with their peers in a positive setting.

\$10,000: Sponsor a Youth Leadership Program

RYSA was founded by youth in 1974 and assisting youth to reach their goals remains one of our top priorities. Over 150 youth access our leadership training program each year. These opportunities assist youth with their education and career aspirations and help to create strong young leaders in our community.

\$25,000: Sponsor a School Breakfast Club

Richmond currently has a poverty rate of 26%, with one in four families struggling to pay for basic necessities such as food. RYSA is working with local schools to set up breakfast clubs that give children a healthy start to their day. Not only do these programs provide a nutritious meal, they also encourage social connections and community through interactive games and activities.

\$50,000: Sponsor a Youth Outreach Program

Youth outreach and support is one of our highest need areas, where at-risk youth are served through one-to-one support by a trained youth worker who can meet their individualized needs. Youth meet with their worker on a weekly or bi-weekly basis for 6 months on average. This allows time for our workers to assist the youth in setting goals, creating an action plan and accomplishing steps towards reaching their goals. Success with this program has included youth finding employment, attending post-secondary education, obtaining housing, restoring family communication and accessing health services. Your donation can make a significant difference in the life of a youth.
